Looking Forward to Next Week: Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

September 26, 2021

After Peter's confession, Jesus predicts His crucifixion. He has set Hi face toward Jerusalem to bar the sin of the world to death on the cross. And with Jesus' completion of His mission near, He begins to call the disciples to greater maturity in faith. This maturity is particularly exemplified by Christian unity. Even as Christians are being called to greater maturity, James warns of the danger of Christians falling into sin and wandering from the truth but promises that the sinner is forgiven and restored by the ministration of the righteous. Nothing binds the Church together like a mutual forgiveness and counsel from God's Word.
